Choose a number of different places around you, for example, sections of different hedges, parts of a field or a pathway.

For each one, pace out three metres in a straight line.

Starting at one end, make a count of the number of different plants that you find along the line.

Compare the number of plants you have found in each of the different places. Why do you think there may be more plants growing in one place than another?



Ollie's Hint: you could collect a leaf of each plant you find or make a drawing to help you keep count.
